The Miracle Africa International Foundation is organized under Swiss law. The Foundation is located at 19, Rue de Saint-Léger in Geneva, Switzerland.



The purpose of the Foundation is to provide to the African people, in particular to its most vulnerable citizens, a better quality of life by initiating, implementing and supporting projects and programs that strive for sustainable development, stability, peace, freedom and liberty on the African continent.

The Foundation strives to encourage not only the development of African human, artistic, cultural, sportive and democratic values but also to promote them. Based on this core purpose the Foundation's goals include:

- The development of educational, health and sport programs
- Promotion of environmental protection initiatives through the sustainable use of Africa's natural resources
- Research and establishment of better conditions for the development of self-sustaining agriculture, industry, trade, services and public administration;
- Promotion of effective schooling and education;
- Protection and promotion of the cultural diversity of Africa, including through the development of cultural exchanges with the international community and Africa;
- Establishment and support of effective health programs, in particular, the implementation of research and treatment facilities and accessible and affordable care centers;
- Support for disabled adults and children, and the nourishment of deprived children;
- Development and support women-oriented projects including for those victims of violence and human trafficking;
- Design and development of forums and exchanges between the public and private sectors of Africa including the opportunity for the international community to contribute to the well-being of Africa;
- Study and research of the social and welfare impact of conflict, famine and disease in Africa.

MESSAGE FROM THE FOUNDER



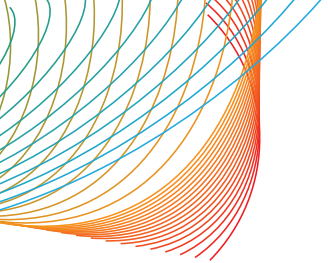

LOOKING AHEAD: A MASTER PLAN FOR ACTIONS

Miracle Africa International Foundation aims at creating a general action plan, or a master plan for actions that can serve as a model and offer guidance to international economic and social actors, governments and world institutions. This master plan would enable each public or private player to select its actions within a general framework and contribute to compose the mosaic by proposing its “initiatives/tiles”.



AREAS OF ACTION



The following action areas have been identified:

- The first is geared towards the primary health needs and aimed at assisting those who are fighting against life-threatening situations, such as ebola, malaria, cholera and recurrent famines.
- The second is directed at providing Permanent Essential Services in all communities to cater for the needs of the most vulnerable groups, such as children and women, by setting up “Centers for Mothers and Children”.
- The third is aimed at improving living conditions in villages by providing fundamental services and infrastructures, such as drinkable water, energy and national communication and integration systems, in line and synergy with the plans of each government.

These problems are listed high among the concerns of governments and supranational organizations to alleviate the problems faced by Africa.

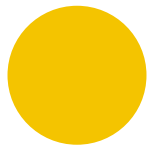

On the basis of this common and shared list of needs, Miracle Africa International Foundation aims at creating an intervention model that will be denominated Miracle GOAfrica and that will encompass all the above mentioned criticalities in order to enable African communities to move beyond the emergency and lay the foundations for a genuine civil progress.

Miracle GOAfrica can become the reference framework for individual initiatives that are not coordinated but that can be integrated into a general framework of synergic and complementary actions.

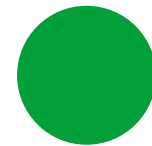

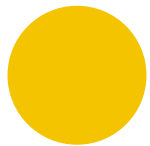

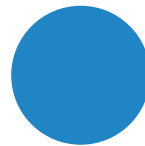

Building "Shelters for Mothers and Children" in each selected village, as well as organizing and supporting their operation.

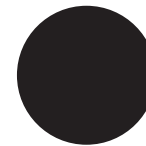

Water treatment

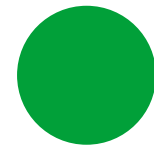

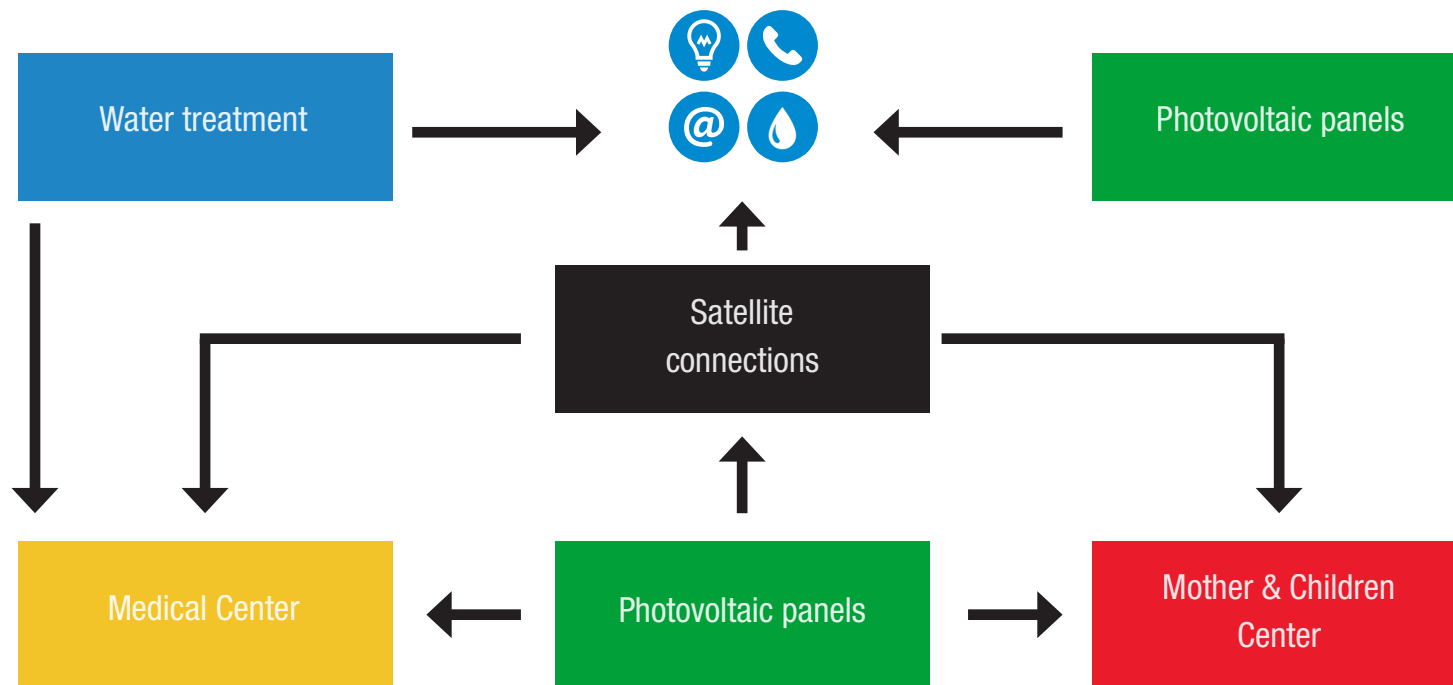

THE PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION



Miracle Africa International Foundation will carry out the following steps aimed at the program implementation:

- Formulation of a executive plan specifying the phases and the budget required (in cooperation with experts in the various medical and technological areas involved);
- Submission to the authorities (with request for sponsorship) in order to identify the countries and the areas for the initial phase;
- Involvement of other associations that are interested in the program;
- Launch of fund raising initiatives;
- Coordination of all actions.

THE IMPLEMENTATION INITIAL PHASE



In order to be able to carry out a first assessment of all technical and economic aspects, MAIF believes that the “Initial Phase” should involve:

5 African countries

priority should be given to the countries that are exposed to epidemics such as malaria, Ebola, HIV in order to test the most urgent actions.

**5/10 communities
or villages**

for each country, i.e. a total number of 25/50 communities, preferably with 1000 inhabitants each.

THE PROGRAM SUSTAINABILITY



Miracle Africa International Foundation, under the sponsorship of the most prominent international and African organizations, will raise the necessary funds as follows:

- By directly promoting its initiatives through events in which the participants are invited to give their contribution and by obtaining support and funds from individuals and private enterprises.
- By cooperating with similar organizations in order to coordinate and use the funds raised in the most suitable and effective manner.



For the actions included in the Initial Phase the budget estimate ranges from 10 million dollars for 25 villages to nearly the double for 50 villages, as some organizational costs will not change.

It goes without saying that the executive plan to be prepared immediately after approval of the project will provide specific budget figures.

By way of conclusion, Miracle Africa International Foundation is calling on the AU to express its interest and sponsor the Miracle GOAfrica Program, with any recommendation that it might deem appropriate. Besides this request for sponsorship, MAIF is inviting the AU to ensure the supervision of the project and its implementation in the way it considers as the most appropriate.

ESTIMATED COSTS

In order to attend the “Start -Go”, in first approximation, a budget of about 10 million for 25 villages, and a little less than double for 50 villages, is evaluated.
